DRAFT INTEGRATED FEASIBILITY REPORT AND ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), Wilmington District, Wilmington, North Carolina, has prepared the Princeville, North Carolina, Flood Risk Management Draft Integrated Feasibility Report and Environmental Assessment (EA), dated March 2014. This draft Integrated Feasibility Report and EA is available for a 30-day review and comment period. Comments are requested. 


The Princeville, North Carolina draft Integrated Feasibility Report and EA proposes a plan to reduce the flooding risk from a 1% chance flood event for the Town of Princeville. The flood reduction plan includes: the addition of flapgates at ungated culverts at eight (8) locations, addressing a low spot in the existing embankment height of U.S. Highway 64, addressing the existing U.S. Highway 33 underpass, and construction of levee segments in specific portions of Highway 258, NC-111, and Shiloh Farms Road (See enclosure). The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969, as amended, requires that the environmental consequences of Federal actions be evaluated, and the details of this proposed action, and the potential environmental consequences be presented to the public.

Commenting Information

The USACE, Wilmington District is soliciting comments from the public, Federal, State, and local agencies and officials, including any consolidated State viewpoint, Indian Tribes, and other interested parties in order to consider and evaluate the impacts of this proposed activity. The USACE, Wilmington District will consider these comments in determining whether a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) or Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will be completed.
