





Fishing Tackle Loaner Program

The fishing tackle loaner program lends out fishing equipment (one rod and one filled tackle box) free of charge to people, especially children, who do not have their own equipment or are reluctant to buy it before first experiencing the thrill of fishing.

Rules For The Fishing Tackle Loaner Program:

- ♦ Only one rod and one tackle box per person.
- ♦ Equipment can only be checked out for a 24 hour period.
- ♦ Lifejackets are also loaned out and are encouraged to wear.
- ♦ Please return all equipment so that others can have an enjoyable time as well.
- ♦ Only individuals over the age of 16 can check equipment out! Please ask parent or guardian for permission.
- ♦ Required individuals must possess a valid state fishing license.

*In state residents 16 and older, and out of state residents 12 and older must purchase a fishing license. (Virginia Law)

*Anybody that is of the age 15 or younger does not need a fishing license. (North Carolina Law)
