

Robert Munford Trail

The trail is approximately 7 miles long; walking its entire length will take about 7 hours. You may make a shorter 2 mile round trip to the cemetery from this trailhead. This will take about 2 hours.

There are some places along the trail that may be submerged during periods of high water. Sturdy walking shoes are recommended.

Note that this trail ends at a trailhead located off State Route 705, Taylor's Ferry Road. You may want to arrange a pick up at that location. Camping is prohibited. Follow the white blazes and enjoy your hike.

This is a multi-use trail. This includes horses, bikers, and hikers. Hikers and bikers please yield to the horses and do not try to scare them. Hikers please yield to bikers. Bikers don't run over pedestrians. Pack in and pack out **all** of your trash. Please take home memories and pictures but leave physical artifacts where they are.

We hope you have enjoyed your experience here on the Robert Munford Trail. These woods are full of history and mystery and now you have added your mark to it. Go from this place with a feeling of serenity and relaxation that comes from being in nature's company. We hope you will visit again soon.

Welcome to the Robert Munford Trail. This trail will lead you along the shoreline of John H. Kerr Reservoir, and through natural areas that only 200 years ago was Robert's Munford home. Robert Munford was one of the most important citizens of early Mecklenburg County. You will see the cemetery where he is buried.

Humans have inhabited this area for thousands of years. Try to find clues of the changes that have taken place. Think about what the area might have looked like as the home of Red Wolves, and the home of Occaneechee Indians, as a tobacco plantation, as a background to the Revolutionary War, and now... What do you think it was like to have lived here?
