

Resolution

Be it resolved that the Southport Board of Aldermen requests the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers to conduct investigations and studies to determine the feasibility of developing an emergency streambank or shoreline erosion protection project at Southport under the authority provided by Section 14 of the 1946 Flood Control Act, as amended.


It is understood that, if it is found feasible and advisable to develop an emergency streambank or shoreline erosion project at Southport, the Board of Aldermen would be required before construction commences to enter into a contractual agreement that it will provide such local cooperation as may be prescribed by the Secretary of the Army.

The City Clerk of the Board of Aldermen shall be, and is hereby, directed to transmit three copies of this resolution to the District Engineer at the attached address.
