- 1. <u>AUTHORIZATION</u>: Construction Authority: Sec. 203 of FCA 1966 (PL 89-789) as modified by WRDA 2986 (PL 99-662). Unconstructed.
- 2. <u>LOCATION AND DESCRIPTION</u>: Holden Beach is a seaside town in Brunswick County, North Carolina, United States. The population was 575 at the 2010 census. It is part of the Myrtle Beach metropolitan area. Holden Beach is in southern Brunswick County The town occupies an 8-milelong (13 km) barrier island on the Atlantic Ocean, bounded by Shallotte Inlet to the west, Lockwood's Folly Inlet to the east, and the Intracoastal Waterway to the north.
- 3. PURPOSE: Hurricane Florence made Landfall as a Category 1 Hurricane just 30 miles to the north of Holden and Oak Island but took a long slow track along the coastline and passing directly over these beaches dropping as a Category 1 storm. The Storm dropped over 20 inches of rain in the area and experienced winds in excess of 60 mph for a duration of approximately 6 hours. The study area is subject to coastal storms of increased frequency and intensity, and the project needs a reformulation of the existing design, including its dunes and berm, to determine if any components of the project's design need to be modified to provide resilience to the impact of erosion, waves and coastal floodwaters on structures, infrastructure and life and safety.
