8. **OTHER INFORMATION:** Wilmington District responded to Town of Yanceyville's request regarding implementation of Dan River Regional Water Supply Project under Section 5113 of WRDA 2007 on February 10, 2017. Section 5113 of WRDA 2007 states that the Secretary may establish a program to provide environmental assistance to non-Federal interests in the State of North Carolina. Assistance provided under this section may be in the form of design and construction assistance for environmental infrastructure and resource protection and development projects in North Carolina, including projects for: wastewater treatment and related facilities; combined sewer overflow, water supply, storage, treatment, and related facilities; drinking water infrastructure including treatment and related facilities; environmental restoration; stormwater infrastructure; and surface water resource protection and development. The Secretary may provide assistance for a project under this section only if the project is publicly owned. Section 5113 cost share requirements – 75% Federal and 25% non-Federal.
