PUBLIC NOTICE

Corps of Engineers seeks public comments on NCDOT Discharge Request

WILMINGTON, N.C. - The Wilmington District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has received an application from the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) seeking Department of the Army authorization to discharge fill material into waters of the United States associated with the proposed 28.8 miles of new alignment for the Complete 540 project in Wake and Johnston Counties. The Complete 540 project encompasses three NCDOT TIP projects: R-2721 (NC-55 Bypass to US-401), R-2828 (east of US 401 to I-40 Interchange), and R-2829 (east of I-40 to US 64/264).

The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public to compare alternatives that have been carried forward for detailed study pursuant to applicable procedures of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. To make this decision, comments are used to assess impacts on endangered species, historic properties, water quality, general environmental effects and all other appropriate public interest factors. Comments are used in the preparation of an Environmental Assessment (EA) and/or an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Comments are also used to determine the need for a public hearing and to determine the overall public interest of the proposed activity.
